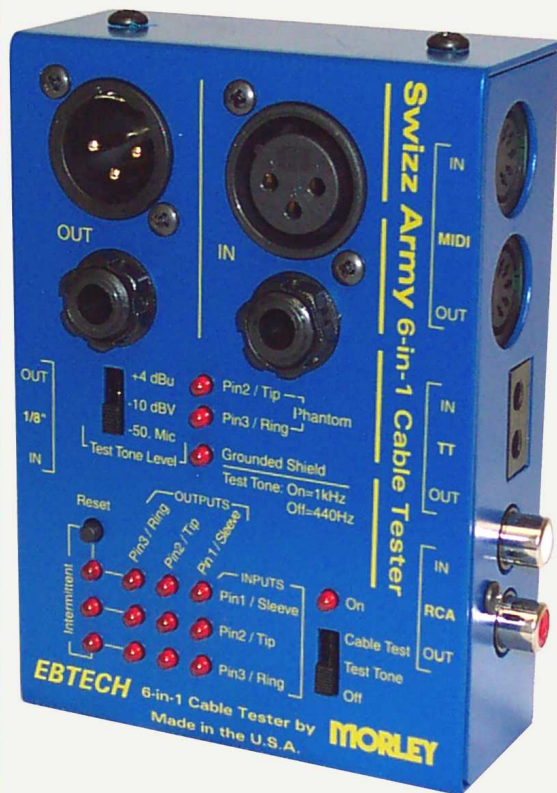

EBTECH SWIZZ ARMY 6 IN 1 CABLE TESTER

A cable tester may not be the sexiest tool in your kit, but when you're dealing with an intermittent cord, it can rescue your gig, rehearsal, or studio session. And a truly flexible tester—such as the Swizz Army



6 In 1 Cable Tester (\$179 retail/\$129 street)—can practically terminate all fears of inopportune electrical failure. The Swizz Army can ferret-out shorts, determine how a cable is wired, detect phantom power (for condenser mics and active direct boxes), generate test tones (for ringing out cables, mixer inputs, and sound systems), identify grounded shields in XLR cables, and even check cables installed in walls (or underground) for permanent P.A. or studio systems. That's flexibility, baby! In addition, the battery-powered unit handles just about all the cables you'll ever use: XLR, 1/4" (mono or TRS), RCA, 1/8" (mono or TRS), TT, and MIDI.

One of the hippest features of the Swizz Army is that it "holds" its reading when it finds a fault so that intermittent cable problems don't blow past you with a flicker of an LED. And the Swizz reveals exactly what is wrong with your cable—whether there's a loss of continuity (signal all the way through), an open (a broken wire), or a short (two wires touching together that shouldn't be). There's no contest. The multi-use Swizz Army is the baddest—let's even say, sexiest—cable savior around. —Darrin Fox
